

# **General Anti-Corruption Strategy for Lebanon**

# 1. Strengthen Legal Frameworks and Institutions

A robust legal and institutional foundation is critical to combating corruption effectively.

### **Amend and Enforce Anti-Corruption Laws**

- **Conflict of Interest Regulation**: Enforce laws requiring public officials to disclose and manage conflicts of interest.

# **Independent Anti-Corruption Commission**

- **Mandate and Authority**: Empower the commission to investigate highlevel corruption, including cases involving ministers and members of parliament.
- **Structure:** Include representatives from civil society, academia, and international anti-corruption organizations to ensure impartiality.
- **Monitoring Mechanisms**: Require regular reporting to parliament and the public on its activities, investigations, and outcomes.
