

Introduction

Welcoming and supporting all people in their enjoyment of reading and pursuit of lifelong learning, and striving to serve them well and effectively by providing equal access to information, ideas and knowledge through books, programs and other resources. **Joun Public Library or Community Library** will also respond to the current and evolving needs of patrons trying to learn, thrive and grow in the 21st century by nurturing learning, supporting economic advancement and strengthening communities.



This document is intended to be a roadmap for the creation of Joun Public Library. It will be powered by the efforts of the Library's dedicated staff, the passions of its patrons, and support from Joun Municipality leadership and a Joun Public Library Foundation which will be established.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 21st century economy is a knowledge-based economy, an economy where innovation is prized, where the power of workers' minds are critical assets. This new economy transcends geographic borders. Globalization is accelerating innovation. And towns are becoming the incubators of that innovation. The most successful towns, in fact, supersede national governments as the economic engines driving our global economy.

To compete in this borderless economic frontier, towns must ensure that their residents are informed and creative, entrepreneurial and innovative, lifelong learners able to absorb and utilize new information.

That's where Joun Community Library come in. Joun Community Library have always been, and continue to be, in the knowledge business. That does not, however, mean they have been static and unchanging institutions. Over the years, Joun Community Library have evolved to support knowledge creation and dissemination in relevant ways. Many decades ago, Joun had a *Rabitah* and a Public Library and had a few hundred

books housed in a modest building in the town. Joun Public Library, shall offer computer tutoring sessions, use multimedia collaboration spaces designed for teens, in addition to design and printing, in addition to a future Library website that will allow patrons online access to library materials, including eBooks, audiobooks and periodicals.

In a knowledge-based economy, Joun Community Library house crucial currency – knowledge in multiple forms – with books and literacy support as core assets. And they are more popular than ever.

Throughout its over 400-year history, as the town of Joun has evolved; And this strategy is intended to guide the Town's evolution over the next decades.

Why a new Public Library in Joun?

A public library in Joun can offer numerous benefits to the community. Here are some key advantages:

1. Access to Information and Resources

- Books and Digital Media: Provides access to a wide range of books, e-books, audiobooks, and online databases.
- Internet Access: Offers free internet and computer access, helping bridge the digital divide¹.

2. Promotion of Literacy and Education

- Reading Programs: Encourages reading habits through programs like story hours, book clubs, and summer reading challenges.
- Educational Workshops: Hosts workshops and classes on various topics, from digital literacy to language learning².

3. Community Hub

- Meeting Space: Serves as a neutral space for community meetings, events, and social gatherings.
- Cultural Events: Organizes cultural activities, such as author talks, art exhibitions, and local history presentations³.

4. Support for Local Businesses

- Business Resources: Provides resources and workshops for local entrepreneurs and small business owners.
- Promotion: Features local products and services, helping to boost the local economy4.

5. Preservation of Culture and History

- Local Archives: Maintains archives of local history, preserving the town's heritage for future generations.
- Cultural Programs: Promotes local culture through events and exhibitions⁵.

6. Social Inclusion and Equity

- Inclusive Programs: Offers programs and services for all age groups and demographics, ensuring everyone feels welcome.
- Support Services: Provides assistance with navigating social services, health information, and other community resources².

7. Lifelong Learning

- Continuous Education: Encourages lifelong learning through access to educational materials and programs for all ages.
- Skill Development: Offers classes and workshops to help individuals develop new skills and hobbies⁴.

8. Safe and Welcoming Environment

- Safe Space: Provides a safe and welcoming environment for children, teens, and adults.
- After-School Programs: Offers after-school programs and homework help, providing a constructive space for youth³.

By establishing a public library, Joun can significantly enhance its community cohesion, educational opportunities, and cultural richness.

Strategic plan for a public library in Joun

Vision and Mission

Vision: To establish a dynamic community hub that promotes lifelong learning, cultural enrichment, and social cohesion.

Mission: To provide accessible resources, innovative programs, and a welcoming space for all residents of Joun to learn, connect, and grow.

Strategic Goals

1. Enhance Access to Resources

- **Objective**: Provide a large library's collection to include a diverse range of books, digital resources, and multimedia.

- Activities:

- Conduct a community survey to identify resource needs.
- Partner with local and international Joun Community Library for resource sharing.
- Invest in e-books and online databases

2. Promote Lifelong Learning

- Objective: Offer educational programs and workshops for all age groups.

- Activities:

- Collaborate with local schools and universities to provide tutoring and study resources.
 - Host workshops on topics like digital literacy, language learning, and local history.
 - Develop a summer reading program for children and teens.

3. Foster Community Engagement

- Objective: Create a welcoming space for community events and activities.

- Activities:

- Organize cultural events, author talks, and art exhibitions.
- Provide meeting spaces for local organizations and clubs.
- Launch a volunteer program to involve community members in library activities.

4. Support Local Businesses and Sustainability

- Feature local products, such as olive oil and carob, in library events.



Joun Public Library shall evolve, it will also need to strategically concentrate its work in areas that meet the current needs and priorities of the Town of Joun and its people.

ACCESS FOR ALL

Why This is Important

Providing every Jouni with access to knowledge, information and experiences is fundamental to Joun Public Library's mission. The Library's commitment to open and free access will be central to all programs, services and operations. Broad access empowers patrons to explore their interests, support their love of reading, engage them with new ideas, achieve their learning goals, find employment, start new businesses and improve and contribute to their communities.

In order to provide broad access, we will be committed to minimizing barriers to use. Jounis – from every neighborhood, of every background – should feel welcome at any Joun Public Library, able to learn, experiment and immerse themselves in knowledge. That access strengthens the core of Joun, connecting every patron with the information he or she needs to participate in all aspects of society. When Jounis can access high-quality resources and are empowered by knowledge, learning and experience, the town will prosper.

How We Will Do It

Joun Public Library will make knowledge and information available and accessible to every Jouni through high-quality:

- Books, print & digital materials
- Programs, information & referral services
- Facilities
- Technology
- Helpful staff

We will provide access by offering relevant collections, driven by patron needs and interests, in a convenient and usable format and offering substantial digital content, like electronic books and online research tools. In addition to content, we will provide patrons with access to world-class, unique and engaging classes, workshops, events and programs.

We will facilitate access by ensuring that our building is safe, clean and welcoming. We will ensure that the facility's design and layout reflect community needs. As the type and format of relevant knowledge changes, we will continue to respond with services and programs that make that knowledge accessible for all Jounis. Within the library, we will provide access to relevant technology to meet local patrons' needs. In order to maintain and expand those efforts, we will be providing free public computing and cutting-edge technology and experiment with new initiatives like lending Wi-Fi hotspots. We will

create engaging digital environments through a flexible website, where patrons can access content, explore interests, share ideas and strengthen skills.

Ensure Access

We will be:

- 1. Designing programs, services and collections based on Jounis' evolving needs and interests by efforts that give people access to new technology. Examples include:
 - A Lab, where patrons access 3D design, scanning and fabrication technology.
 - Internet to Go, which allows patrons to check out Wi-Fi hotspots enabling them to access information anywhere.
 - A new Software as a Service website and phone app to ease access to content for patrons anytime, anywhere and with any device.
 - Digitized special collections, including municipal records, allowing users to access specialized information online.
 - Programmable robots, to help kids any age learn computer programming, and can be borrowed from any branch.
 - Photocopiers to digital scanners.
 - Offering homework help in every neighborhood branch and online every day.
- 2. Deepening the impact of the Library's extensive physical assets in every neighborhood in Joun. Examples include:
 - Launching the first-ever Master Plan for the flagship Harold Washington Library Center, focusing on maximizing economic and educational impacts and cultural enrichment.
 - Preparing for similar, localized Master Plans for Woodson and Sulzer Regional Joun Community Library and neighborhood branches to ensure all locations are contributing as fully
- 3. Delivering services, not only within the walls of the library, but also in patrons' homes, schools and workplaces through our online presence. Examples include:
 - A distribution service that delivers digital magazines to the patron on their favorite digital device.
 - A service that allows Joun Community Library to offer patrons access to movies, television, music and audiobooks.
 - Electronic books.
 - Online homework helps with a library card that also offers paper reviews and test preparation.
 - Designing spaces at the Library to better meet patron needs.

- 4. Promoting fully inclusive policies that support our principle of free and open access. Examples include:
- Lending Wi-Fi hotspots in an effort to mitigate the digital divide.
- Allowing residents, the ability to apply for an e-card online, giving them the ability to check out materials, stream music or movies, access resources and place holds, all online.
- Waiving replacement card fees for children receiving cards through library card campaigns with local schools.



STRATEGIC FOCUS AREAS

In the next four years, our strategy will revolve around three initiatives to help patrons of all ages and from all walks of life thrive in a rapidly-changing world:

NURTURE LEARNING

Why This is Important

Joun Public Library will be a key educational resource for Jounis. Everyone from toddlers to seniors will use the library as a place to learn and discover. And indeed, as the need for continuous, lifelong learning becomes more pronounced and the ways in which people can learn evolve, we will have the opportunity to support that learning in a variety of ways: workshops, labs, peer to peer connections, online and through other self-directed activities.

In a time when learning has become more personalized, Joun Public Library, will collaborate with leading educators, to supplement traditional education with high-quality programs and resources.

How We Will Do It

We will nurture learning for patrons of all ages. Library staff will support early childhood and pre-kindergarten educational goals through family and caregiver engagement and support children, teens, and adults through late life. We will leverage our professional knowledge and resources to help patrons build literacy and foster additional 21st century skills: digital, cultural and information literacy; critical thinking and problem solving; creativity and innovation; and communication and collaboration. And we will do so through children's classes and story time; a Summer Learning Challenge, will be designed to combat summer learning loss and increase student excitement for learning science, technology, engineering, math and the arts; media, mentor-led teen learning spaces that foster creativity and collaboration while exposing and supporting teens to explore career pathways related to their interests; and the Lab, which will offer patrons access to 3D design and fabrication. We also strive to provide patrons resources and support to facilitate adaptive, personalized learning, and to make new investments to maintain our best-in-class collections, buildings and technology.

In sum, Joun Public Library will nurture learning in different ways for four groups of patrons:

- 1. Families with Young Children,
- 2. School-Aged Children,
- 3. Teens and
- 4. Adults.



For Joun's families with young Children, we will be:

- 1. Focusing on professional development for children's librarians to ensure a well-trained staff with early-childhood development expertise.
- 2. Explicitly communicating staff expertise and skills to patrons and external partners to ensure that they are utilized maximally.
- 3. Focusing on engaging parents and caregivers to help their children build a foundation of literacy to underlie future success.
- 4. Providing best-in-class programs and services that advance early-childhood and pre-kindergarten learning. Examples include:
 - Offering relevant, supportive resources including a current, diverse and responsive collection of books, toys and age-appropriate digital materials that support learning.
 - Creating a family-friendly environment, using design and research to develop spaces that support how children, play, discover and learn.

For Joun's School-Aged Children, we will be:

- 1. Maintaining welcoming, safe and technology- enhanced spaces for learning and exploration. Examples include:
- Ensuring locations and hours are accessible for youth.
- Providing access to technology in every community.
- Providing safe spaces for studying, exploring ideas and learning.
- Designing spaces, where feasible, to support the ways that kids learn both alone and in groups.

- 2. Providing expert staff, who are trained to support learning, who will instill a love of reading and engage children's curiosity and exploration.
- 3. Offering STEAM-focused materials, workshops and interactive learning opportunities that encourage school-aged children to become involved with science, technology, engineering, arts and math learning early. Examples include:
- Sharing evidence-based resources that support early literacy skills for children that parents and caregivers can practice at home and that help celebrate the power of parents in a child's life.
- Modeling effective practices for parents and caregivers through story time and other family focused programs in library branches and in community-based early childhood centers.
- Hosting workshops for parents and caregivers on child-related topics (e.g. special needs resources).
- Providing family field trips to museums to promote learning opportunities.
- 4. Offering an array of evidence-based programs and services in partnerships with schools and cultural institutions that advance learning throughout the school year. Examples include:
- Offering engaging, award-winning summer programs that can help prevent summer learning loss and support students to start or return to school each autumn better prepared to learn.
- Offering out-of-school time experiences to advance literacy and 21st century skills (e.g. science programming in partnership with the Museum of Science and Industry).
- Coordinating with partner organizations to scale effective programs and enhance learning opportunities that meet children's learning goals.
- 5. Pursuing opportunities to support adaptive and self- paced education, allowing school-aged children to actively participate and learn in a personalized way. Examples include:
- Using patron data and staff knowledge to further develop book collections and other content to support learning (e.g. blocks, games, play materials and ageappropriate technology, such as tablets).
- Bringing STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math) learning to families with young children (e.g., Summer Learning Challenge, and Science Connections programming, including Mini Scientist programs).
- Referring families to high quality online tools and resources that support learning.


- 6. Providing a full complement of relevant resources and reference services including a current and diverse collection of books, digital content, games and technology to advance learning and promote the joy and importance of reading for children and their caregivers.
- 7. Offering programs and workshops for parents and other caregivers to enhance caregivers' ability to support their school-aged children. Examples include:
- Creating Best of the Best, an annual day of review of the best books and media for children.
- Promoting hands-on learning for parents and educators in STEAM and other workshops.
- Providing on-site early learning programs in pediatric clinics, connecting parents and caregivers to Library resources and teaching them effective early literacy practices.

For Joun's Teens, we will be:

- 1. Providing knowledgeable, well-trained library staff with the expertise to support teens' social development, interests and learning. Examples include:
- Equipping staff to serve as mentors for teen patrons.
- Invigorating program design with peer-learning and peer-sharing practices.
- Implementing evidence-based practices for supporting teens' success in school and life, promoting civic engagement and providing pathways for post-secondary education and career planning.
- Partnering with world-class organizations for collaborative programming and to expose teens to a broad range of experiences.
- Offering opportunities for teens to grow and learn while they serve as mentors for younger children through near peer STEM mentoring.
- Engaging teens in creating cultural programming (e.g., STEAM Studio).
- 2. Creating engaging and welcoming spaces to support teens' learning and discovery in a social setting.
- 3. Facilitating access to relevant and engaging materials, including state-of the-art technology and digital resources. Examples include:
- Developing engaging collections (books, eBooks, graphic novels, etc.) based on teen interests and feedback.
- Providing access to an array of production resources including industry-grade design software, photo and audio equipment, makerspaces, and gaming systems.
- Optimizing dedicated teen content discovery areas in all locations, including online.

- Providing access to technology, resources and collections that inspire exploration, creativity and learning (e.g. vinyl cutters, robotics kits, 3D printers, etc.).
- 2. Offering interest-based projects, activities and mentorship to develop teens' 21st century skills, supporting academic needs and fostering personal growth. Examples include:
- Empowering teens to create and design activities at the library.
- Giving teens resources and tools to explore their interests, create new things, and work collaboratively on projects that inspire them through media and Labs.
- 3. Providing connection to college and career pathways, including structured career exploration opportunities such as experiences with special emphasis on digital media, arts and technology careers. Examples include:
- Leading the field in open micro-credentials (or "badging") that allow teens to showcase the skills they learn.
- Working with educational institutions to provide career development experiences and service learning opportunities.
- 4. Providing a full complement of relevant resources and reference services including a current and diverse collection of books, digital content, games and technology to advance learning and promote the joy and importance of reading for children and their caregivers.
- 5. Nurturing learning is not a single act, but rather, a series of decisions made to provide patrons of all ages and backgrounds with the support and services they need to learn and grow throughout their lives. Our efforts to nurture learning will extend to our youngest patrons and their families.
- 6. For school-aged children, nurturing learning focuses on bringing education to kids year-round. Over the next several years with private support through Joun Public Library, we will create a summer learning program, turning such a program into an innovative STEAM experience that includes books, science experiments, games, artistic efforts and online digital literacy building, and aligns with educational standards.
- 7. For teens, nurturing learning also means providing a 21st century teen learning environment, where mentors facilitate learning and development with media creation tools and software, YOUmedia allows teens to learn and apply digital media skills to creating digital products from songs to podcasts and 3D printed products.
- 8. Finally, nurturing learning expands beyond children and students to adults for economic, cultural and interest- based learning and skill-building. Programs such as Peer to Peer University peer learning circles facilitate collaboration, learning, and accountability while using free online education courses. Additionally, we will

be working with partners to build a digital skills curriculum that support adult and senior citizen learning for the 21st century.



For Joun's Adults, we will be:

- 1. Maintaining a well-trained staff that provides reference and research guidance, including referrals to outside organizations. Examples include:
- Equipping and training staff to refer patrons to relevant, high-quality resources throughout Joun and bring those resources to the library as needed.
- Provide staff with the tools and training they need to create personalized recommendations based on patron interest.
- 2. Designing and offering programs and services to enable social learning, such as programming that supports patrons to fully utilize online open educational resources. For example:
- Partnering with organizations such as Peer-to-Peer University to offer Learning Circles, community- based learning opportunities in topics as diverse as Computer Programming, Creative Writing and Public Speaking in neighborhood Joun Community Library.
- 3. Stocking current, diverse and engaging books and digital content that meet the needs of Joun's adults and are responsive to their interests. Examples include:
- Creating and implementing a plan to build a successful patron driven acquisition pilot.
- Supporting and expanding availability of digital content such as books, movies, music, magazines and audiobooks.
- Making available new, non-traditional resources for circulation.
- 4. Designing and offering programs and services to build cultural literacy. Examples include:

- Making unique cultural events accessible at the Library and neighborhood locations in partnership with world- class cultural institutions.
- Bringing engaging cultural events to neighborhood branches in support of a Joun's Cultural Plan.
- 5. Designing and offering programs and services to build vital economic literacy, including understanding of financial, legal, healthcare and citizenship topics, in partnership with community groups, financial institutions, government agencies and schools. Examples include:
- Delivering financial literacy programming.

SUPPORT ECONOMIC ADVANCEMENT



Why This is Important

Joun, along with other major towns and cities in Lebanon, is undergoing rapid transformation. As this happens, the necessary workplace skills, the preferred business and service models, and the definitions of what makes a place an attractive business hub are also undergoing dramatic transformation. Given these changes, Joun will be evaluating its assets and development strategies to ensure that it is able to succeed in this changing and fluid economy.

Joun Public Library is a key partner for Joun's economic development initiatives that focus on people and quality of life. Joun's "Neighborhood Small Business Growth Strategy" focuses on maintaining a vibrant base of small businesses, a major source of local job creation. Similarly, the "Plan for Economic Growth and Jobs Strategies" and the "Joun Technology Plan" focus on creating a competitive, mobile and globally-focused entrepreneurial environment within Joun. These strategies focus on building on local strengths, with a mix of residential, commercial and cultural activities to create a vibrant Joun with a high quality of life. The Library provides a broad range of information services and support for diverse constituencies throughout Joun. We will be exploring innovative ways to support Joun's economic vitality by leveraging those resources.

How We Will Do It

Joun Public Library will play a key role in providing tangible support to Jounis who are looking for a new job, seeking to advance in their current job, start a new business or grow their existing small business. The Library can help build economic opportunities by supporting people in acquiring basic skills, getting job referrals, finding employment and developing their businesses.

We can do this through programs (like resume workshops hosted in the library), services (like research assistance), partnerships with workforce development organizations and other local networks, and the investments we will make to maintain and improve our best-in-class collections, buildings and technology that support patron needs.

Our future staff – with their unique talents and expertise – will support all Jounis in their quest to achieve their economic and life goals. We help job seekers, entrepreneurs and small business owners build skills and knowledge to achieve their economic goals.

For Joun's Job Seekers, we will be:

- 1. Supporting the development of technology skills. Examples include:
- With support from the Library, we can offer support for patrons to develop basic technology skills (e.g. email set up, internet search) that enable them to participate in today's labor market.
- Helping patrons understand and master a set of standard digital skills that will help them fully engage in their chosen career path.
- Hosting workshops and services to advance career skills and employment in partnership with best-in- class workforce organizations.
- 2. Creating an efficient process for connecting job seekers to high-quality resources and services. Examples include:
- Providing access to computers with industry standard software and leveraging technology (Wi-Fi, public computers, printers) to support job search.
- Providing referral services that connect job- seekers to best-in-class career services provided by workforce development organizations and educational institutions throughout Joun.
- 3. Designing and offering programs and services to build cultural literacy. Examples include:
- Making unique cultural events accessible at the Harold Washington Library Center and neighborhood locations in partnership with world- class cultural institutions

 Bringing engaging cultural events to neighborhood branches in support of Joun's Cultural Plan.

For Joun's Small Business Owners, we will be:

- 1. Providing research services and relevant materials and collections delivered by expert staff. Examples include:
- Assisting patrons as part of reference services in finding the materials they need to support their business goals (e.g. patent information).
- Providing current, diverse and responsive books and other content that support small business needs.
- 2. Offering guidance and referrals to organizations throughout Joun that have small business-focused resources and relationships. Examples include:
- Guiding patrons in navigating the range of information and organizations available throughout Joun.
- Referring patrons to organizations with small- business-specific resources (e.g. zoning maps).
- Connecting patrons with valuable relationships (e.g. Chambers of Commerce).
- 3. Facilitating access to supporting services including mentorship and workshops. Examples include:
- Partnering with organizations to provide one-on-one help in crafting a business plan.
- Hosting events in Joun to provide assistance in starting non-profit organizations, nonprofit businesses or social good businesses.

Joun Public Library will be well positioned to support Jounis' economic advancement. We will help adults navigate job searches with tools, tips and referrals to high quality career development and training providers.

We will host workshops and classes to support career development and learning. We will be working to connect the library to College and Universities leaders, so that the Library can guide education and job seekers to the appropriate educational supports.

The Library will be also building relationships with Chambers of Commerce to connect them with and support small businesses. Additionally, we will be working with existing incubators to support entrepreneurs and business planning and development. Finally, we will make the library a friendly place for patrons to work, including making space available for collaboration, offering access to computers and printers.

STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES


Why This is Important

Joun Public Library will serve as community anchor, space where people come together for civic and community activities. It will act as an artery that allows cultural and civic assets to flow throughout Joun. The library can be leveraged to increase civic and community awareness, engagement and activity.

We know that engaged and empowered residents generate optimism about the future, produce good decisions on high-need community challenges and contribute to both economic growth and individual well-being.

Because of its potentially broad footprint, the library will be highly visible in all communities in Joun. Library staff will be trusted neighborhood leaders, engaging with local organizations, departments, schools and more, in shaping and leading discussions, decisions and strategies that foster active and purposeful civic engagement and community building. In Joun, the library will be unique and represent the spirit of the town of Joun.

The nature of Joun's library will allows for diverse people to come together and exchange ideas in a safe environment.



How We Will Do It

We will thoughtfully examine the ways our library can support the neighborhoods in Joun. This could include locally-relevant collections, programs, One Joun book clubs and services tailored to community needs.

Increasingly, strengthening communities means creating flexible physical spaces for community engagement by creating more open spaces and transparency in the building which, increases the richness of interactions among patrons and between patrons and their local communities.

It means providing space to host civic activities like polling and community meetings ranging from neighborhood organizations and others.

Strengthening communities means that the library works to foster community collaboration and help Joun neighborhoods discover its potential. The Library staff and managers can build relationships with a number of Joun and local organizations to connect patrons with relevant resources.

The Library will serve communities in two broad categories: neighborhoods and groups whose shared interests bring them together to form a community.

For Joun's Neighborhood and Communities, we will be:

- Providing meeting space for Community Based Organizations and neighborhood groups to convene, host activities and offer information and services to patrons. Examples include:
 - Making study and community rooms accessible through online reservation system.
 - 2. Housing celebrations of neighborhood and cultural history through partnerships with local organizations. Examples include:
 - Featuring rotating exhibits that celebrate Joun and make the most of the Library's archival and special collections.
 - Partnering with neighborhood institutions for outreach at local events.
 - 3. Providing a safe haven and welcoming environment for all programs and services. Examples include:
 - Updating the Library's Guidelines Governing Use to ensure safe and welcoming Joun Community Library for all visitors.
 - Working with partners in Joun's local law enforcement, schools and other community stakeholders to foster general community safety.
 - 4. Fostering connections to resources throughout Joun, especially for underserved patrons, with needed community resources (e.g., DFSS and other Joun services).
 - 5. Hosting programs and resources that foster civic engagement. Examples include:
 - Hosting community meetings that foster civic engagement.
 - Displaying materials on civic engagement during civic events such as voting.
 - 6. Highlighting interest-based collections and relevant materials to support patron interests in physical and digital spaces. Examples include:

- Featuring showcases to cultivate patron interests and foster awareness of the Library's collections.
- Partnering with local institutions and organizations to provide interest-based collections and topic- specific displays (e.g. Joun Artist Month).
- Empowering patrons to create interest-based collections online through creating lists and rating materials.
- 7. Connecting neighborhoods to cultural, learning and civic activities across Joun. Examples include:
 - Architectural Heritage of Joun.
 - Partnering with the Lebanese conservatoire to bring programming into Joun neighborhoods.
 - Providing digitized versions of key municipal and historical neighborhood documents.

Strong communities are connected communities, engaged communities and inspired communities. And the Joun Public Library will be offering a variety of services, programs and resources – some high profile, others less well known – that, taken together, will make the Library the hub of the communities it serves.

Some resources – like learning challenges, concert and theater performances and tech and other classes – will be used and loved by patrons.

Others are hidden gems that provide crucial support in strengthening communities. For example, a Library's special collections on Joun history, will contain a wealth of information for those interested in Joun community history.

These collections could help to illustrate through primary source materials on how Joun has evolved. Similarly, a Municipal Reference Collection would be a vast trove of information on community and civic statistics, data, ordinances, budgets and annual reports at the Library.



SERVE PATRONS EFFECTIVELY

Why This is Important

The Library will be driven by the belief that the better we understand our patrons, the better our service design decisions will be. Our institution's service and program design efforts will be driven by a deep curiosity about our users and how they experience services in the library, outside the library and online.

How We Will Do It

We will be focused on providing patrons the best programs, services and facilities to fit their needs. Serving patrons effectively will be at the heart of our commitment to Joun and all its residents.

To do that, it is critical that we look at how our staff and facilities meet patron needs. This includes staff development, policies that affect the patron experience and the design and use of library space.



For Joun's Neighborhoods and Communities, we will be:

- Equip staff with best-in-class leadership, technical and customer service skills to foster patron- focused innovation and creative-problem solving throughout the Library. Examples include:
 - Engaging Library staff in human-centered design thinking and to be more responsive to patron needs.
 - Testing new ideas for serving patrons and then scaling them successfully.
 - Increased utilization of technology, including bar coding in automated materials handling systems.
 - Using cloud computing to allow patrons to access resources online (e.g. offering ability to pay fines online).
 - Bringing advanced material checkout technology to the branches, including selfcheckout and roving mobile checkout.

- Utilizing beacon technology to understand traffic flow and service patterns.
- 2. Developing increasingly engaging patron-focused library and digital spaces. Examples include:
 - Investing in a comprehensive digitization strategy, allowing digital access documents, artifacts and other materials and exploring ways in which patrons can engage with special collections in digital spaces.
- 3. Performing annual strategic planning and external environmental scans leading to clear work plans and metrics-based evaluations for priority initiatives.
- 4. Improving current physical technology infrastructure (e.g. digital scanners).
- 5. Growing our strong brand and driving more comprehensive awareness across all potential patrons and stakeholders. For example:
 - Using digital marketing to improve service to patrons, including monitoring what is being viewed, how often, for how long, and what content works or doesn't for patrons.
- 6. Engaging patrons through surveys, observation and interviews to learn about their needs and interests, and proactively designing collaborative approaches with relevant organizations to meet those needs.

CONCLUSION

Joun Public Library will be a unique and most visited cultural institution in Joun, a place woven into the lives of countless Jounis. Since early initiatives for establishing a library in Joun during the times of the Cultural Rabtah *of Joun*, Joun Public Library will provide access to all and to serve patrons effectively.

Joun evolution continues today. Working alongside Joun Public Library Foundation, the Mayor's Office, Joun Council and like-minded partners to adapt to the fast-paced, innovation-centered, 21st century knowledge economy, Joun Public Library will, in fact, become a model for other Joun Community Library in Lebanon.

This strategy details how we will build on our town successes. We will maintain our focus on our foundational mission of providing access to all, and serving patrons effectively.

Our vision is for transforming Joun Community Library in Lebanon into centers of learning that help towns residents thrive in the 21st-century economy by nurturing learning, supporting economic advancement and strengthening communities.

This proposal outlines the vision, objectives, and activities for establishing a community library in the Town of Joun, Lebanon. The Library is aimed at enriching lives and empowering individuals through increased access to information, education, and cultural resources. By promoting literacy and community engagement, these Joun Community Library will become hubs of knowledge, creativity, and collaboration, transforming communities into thriving environments of growth and opportunity.

Library Vision

Joun Public Library and Joun Library Foundation seek to establish a community library in the near future. The library has the potential to play an important role in the revitalization of the town of Joun and the neighboring towns and could serve as an anchor tenant for a multi-use development. The goal of the library is to meet the following needs:

- Serve as a neutral space where all are welcome and residents from different age, cultural and socio-economic backgrounds can interact and learn from each other.
- Provide resources for towns workers: a quiet space for breaks, convenient materials pick-up and drop-offs, and services for career growth.
- Serve as a community connector by partnering with local groups to host cultural and educational events and classes, and provide space for non-library meetings and events.
- Serve as a catalyst for the Iqlim al Kharroub region's development.

The Joun Public Library won't look like a typical library, packed with rows of books and people quietly reading in corners. Instead, it will be a highly flexible space that is an exciting and vibrant hub of activity. Residents will stop by to pick up the books and DVDs they placed on hold online. Job seekers and tourists will use the free Wi-Fi and small business center to print documents. Local residents will stop by for classes and entertainment. In the evening, educational and cultural groups will offer courses in the large community room.

While a small collection of popular books and DVDs will be available for check-out and magazines and newspapers will be available for browsing, staff will be much more

focused on creating and curating experiences and offering services to customers. Staff will also go into the community to develop partnerships with local businesses and service providers to bring timely and relevant programs into the library.

Apart from programs, the library will provide flexible spaces to suit various user groups. Furniture will be on wheels so that users can move tables and chairs around to create different configurations for reading, group projects, events and small meetings. The library will have a large community meeting room, as well as several study rooms (for 2-6 people) for small business meetings, group projects or quiet studying.

Finally, the library will have public computers, as well as laptops and devices for checkout within the library, and a wireless printer/copier/scanner to provide basic business services. The Library anticipates that with an opening in the next few years, there will still be a need for desktop computer stations. However, it is possible that over time, this need could be fulfilled solely with laptops and portable devices for check out..

Problem Statement

In many underserved communities, access to educational resources and literacy programs remains limited. Factors such as poverty, lack of transportation, and insufficient funding for educational initiatives contribute to low literacy rates and hinder personal and professional development. Many individuals, especially children and marginalized groups, lack access to books, technology, and learning opportunities, leading to cycles of poverty and limited future prospects. Establishing Joun Community Library can address these challenges by providing free access to resources, literacy programs, and a supportive environment for learning.

Objectives

Enhance Literacy Levels:

Despite the good literacy rates in Joun itself, an increase in literacy rates in the region will be crucial by providing access to a wide range of reading materials and implementing targeted literacy programs for children and adults, aiming for a minimum 20% improvement in literacy levels within three years.

Establish Resource Centers:

Create well-stocked Joun Community Library that serve as resource centers, offering books, digital media, educational tools, and internet access to facilitate learning and research for all age groups.

Foster Community Engagement:

Promote community involvement through regular events, workshops, and programs that encourage participation, collaboration, and dialogue among residents, targeting a participation rate of at least 50% of the community within the first year.

Support Local Talent:

FACILITY REQUIREMENTS

Exterior/Site

- Located in a selected place in Joun; the closer to Town's core, the better.
- Ground level/storefront entrance.
- Plenty of windows for maximum visibility from the street.
- Handicap access, and preferably handicap parking within 1 block.
- Access to bus route.
- · Co-located with or close to a café.
- A site with potential to expand for future growth.

Interior

- The entire facility will need adequate electrical/Internet outlets along walls and in the floors to allow users to power their personal devices and access the Library's public computers; the library will need adequate broadband delivery as well.
- A large program room with kitchenette for programs and classes; ideally, the room will have its own secure entrance that community partners could access with a key code for off-hours events.
- 2-4 small meeting rooms for small group study or business meetings; ideally, these rooms will have moveable walls so they can be set up in configurations for different needs.
- An enclosed staff workroom for 3-4 work stations (a single countertop with multiple computer stations) and additional storage space, plus a kitchenette/small break area. A private staff restroom would be preferable.
- Restrooms: restrooms are resource-intensive for libraries. A shared restroom
 outside of the library in a multi-use facility would be ideal. Otherwise,
 consideration will need to go into designing restrooms that are safe, easy to
 maintain and don't allow for a single user to lock themselves inside to vandalize
 the space or do illicit activities.
- The remaining space should be an open floor plan that the library can fill with reading chairs, partitions and tables on wheels that can be moved into different configurations depending on the user's needs. Within that space:
- Approximately one quarter of the open floor space will be for computer stations.
- Shelving will be limited to a small collection of popular books and DVDs, as well as a shelf for patron holds. Ideally, shelving would go along the walls, to keep the floor space open.
- Have spaces for displaying art, especially work created by local artists, art and/or rotating exhibits/pieces from the town of joun and surrounding towns.
