





  - a. Yes:

- 2. Is there funding available for construction without additional taxation?

- Possible Funding from International donors see later on in the document.
- 3. What about Construction Grants?
- a. This is difficult to determine, but initial findings for grants with the purpose of constructing new facilities is in the negative possibility.
- b. However, there are many grants available for covering operating expenses. See later section.
- 4. Is a Town bond possible to cover construction costs?

#### MARKETING PLAN

A marketing plan for the facility and its programs is essential. This document, when prepared, should target specific markets, programs, facilities and user

groups. It needs to be an active document that is utilized to guide all marketing efforts.

This plan should be updated yearly. Special emphasis must be placed on promoting the sale of annual passes to establish a strong revenue base. The business market should also be a major focus of the marketing effort as well.

#### **CAPITAL BUDGET**

The capital budget will include design and construction costs as well as funding for these costs.

#### **OPERATING MODELS**

#### **Assumptions:**

- The projected hours of operation of the community recreation center are as follows: Monday - Friday 6:00am to10:00pm; Saturday - 8:00am to 8:00pm; Sunday - Noon to 8:00pm (Hours per week: 100). Hours usually vary by season (longer hours in the winter, shorter during the summer), by programming needs, use patterns and special event considerations.
- Selected facilities like the Youth Activity Center, Small meeting rooms, and Community Family Room, as well as outdoor facilities would be free of charge.
- Daily passes and/or annual memberships will provide access to gym and pool(s).
- There will be fees for facility rentals for meetings, weddings, birthday parties etc., and recreational programs.
- Fee for Town residents will be 30% higher while people from outside the Town will pay 50% more than residents of the Town.

# **Operational Costs**

#### Expenses

Staffing costs are the biggest single operating expense and alternative options need to be investigated if costs are to be significantly reduced.

The use of volunteers, trading facility use for labor and other similar ideas, deserve consideration as methods to reduce staffing budgets.

Other expenses for managing the facility, operating programs, utility, building costs, long-term capital replacement needs, will be based mainly on similar facilities in Lebanon.

The total annual expense should be done after examining similar projects.

Total annual expenses should be consequently estimated.

#### **Revenue Streams**

A goal of consistently covering about 45% of operational expenses with revenues should be set though it may be difficult to achieve that.

There is little to no possibility of recovering all the operating expenses through facility revenues.

It must be realized that most of the recreation centers that have been built in the last ten years are not covering their entire operating expenses with revenues.

Maximizing revenue production should be a primary goal.

Care must be taken to make sure that a fees and charges policy is consistently followed.

No form of revenue production should be given away.

Revenue streams will mainly be from:

- Rentals and recreational programs
- Daily passes and Memberships

Other revenue can be generated from:

- Advertising spaces within the Community Center
- Grants International or local especially if there are after-school programs.
- Equipment rentals
- Programs/activity fees
- Vending and game machines
- Facility hire charges

Locker space will be limited so patrons can take advantage and secure space through monthly and annual rentals.

- The facility can charge some fees for child care for patrons while they work out or attend functions or activities.
- There can be Family Night Specials to boost patronage. Half price off daily rates could be charged for a specific period.
- The above fee amounts are adapted from the current fees charged in the Chouf area and are thus only for planning purposes.
- The Center management will have to determine a set of fees at the appropriate time.
- Fees charged for programs, activities, and classes will be according to the actual costs.

# **Capital costs**

#### **Cost of Construction**

There are a host of variables that can drive the cost of construction, based on the kinds of functions and services offered by the Community Center.

The economy of Lebanon is also a very important factor in construction cost as well as the type of construction the Town intends to build.

In this regard Lebanese architecture and engineering companies will be a great help: Example to inquire about: median cost of construction for 2024 (USD per square meter).

The cost of construction cannot be determined now unless a cost planner or quantity surveyor has prepared a cost plan showing:

- Site survey
- Site preparation

- Construction costs
- Technical systems and utilities
- Fixed equipment and furniture
- Access roads and support facilities
- Consultants' fees and planning costs
- Legal and administration costs
- Contingency

# Capital replacement fund

A plan for funding a capital replacement program should be developed before the center opens. The Public Works Association recommends between 2% and 4% of replacement cost be budgeted annually for capital items.

# **Sources of Capital Funding**

- Town Taxes
- Matching donations (National and International)
- Contributions from potential user groups
- Sponsorship (limited)

# About adding a Business Incubator for Joun

One of the exciting ways communities are infused with new energy is through these business incubators that are popping up around Lebanon and the Middle East area.

The idea is that there are people especially young people who are looking to start or have just started small-businesses, but need space and professional development support.

Small business start-ups would rent space within the Center to begin building their business. Surrounded by others trying to do similar projects there is an infectious energy and built in support as people try new things and gather ideas from each other.

This would include business owners, college entrepreneurship leaders, and school children and youth.

With a venture like this there needs to be an experience person leading and organizing the space and offering support to the small business leaders.

Space is provided not just for their own business needs but also to meet the need for creativity, encouragement and guidance, and feedback. In addition, this provides a practical meeting and conference space to meet with potential clients or partners.

#### Recommendation

The design, image and quality of the community center have a direct impact on its ability to attract and keep customers.

Based on the following factors:

- Capital: There must be enough capital to finance the construction of the structure and equip it.
- Operational capital: There is the need to have considerable budget per year to operate the facility.
- Land: There should be a sizeable land to put the structure on and provide enough parking spaces.
- Support and patronage: The community should support the running of the facility in patronage, cash, and in kind (volunteer hours).

•

It is recommended that the Town of Joun should pursue the idea of having a community center by seeking funds or grants for construction. Once this is achieved, the remaining factors may be easily satisfied.


